Two on theft charges

TWO MEN, charged with stealing more than \$7 000 worth of wiring, were remanded when they appeared in the District "A" Magistrates' Court yesterday.

Edwin Malcolm Yearwood, 31, of Sobers Alley, Reed Street, St Michael, and Antoine Mark King, 30, a carwasher of no fixed place of abode, were not required to plead to stealing \$7 205 worth of copper wiring, belonging to Peter Evelyn, on June 18.

Acting Station Sergeant Junior Kirton objected to bail for the accused, citing Yearwood's antecedents and King's lack of an address.

Magistrate Pamela Beckles remanded the two until next Friday when they reappear in court.

Biko Holloway, 24, of 2nd Avenue, Chapman Lane, St Michael, denied he dishonestly received seven bottles of tequila, belonging to Hanshell Inniss, between Wednesday and Thursday.

The accused returns to court on August 18.
